After the Pledge of Allegiance, Vice President Shore called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

VACANCY BOARD

Davis Howell said James Francis and David Besselman were interviewed for the Council position and the Vacancy Board is recommending Mr. Besselman for the position. Councilman Cummings made a motion to accept David Besselman's name to petition the court, 2nd by Councilman Duffy, motion carried. Glenn Diehl will get the petition for Mr. Howell to sign and submit to the County. Because the 15 day time limit expired for the Vacancy Board to recommend the vacant seat to Council, a petition has to be filed with the County.

PUBLIC HEARING - PROPOSED EIT ORINANCE

There were no comments from Council or the public.

The public hearing was closed

ORDINANCE #229 – EIT ORDINANCE

Councilman Duffy made a motion to approve Ordinance #229, 2nd by Councilman Snyder, motion carried.

RESIDENT/PUBLIC COMMENT

EAST PENN RAILROAD - BOB PARKER - OWNER

Mr. Parker said he has been working with PennDOT and now has secured funds to redo the railroad crossing at Route 41. Redoing the crossing will address three different problems; the surface is in bad shape, electrical problems due to the flooding and water pipe leak we had this past year, and the traffic lights almost sit right in front of the railroad signals and block the view. Mr. Parker said he is here tonight to ask Council for a letter that the Borough has no objection combining the traffic signals and the railroad signals on the same mast. There will be no cost to the Borough; it is 100% Federal money. Mr. Parker said he would take care of getting the revised signal permit from PennDOT and the mast would be the responsibility of East Penn Railroad. Council agreed to write the letter.

FIRE HYDRANT ON MINOR STREET

Mr. Fansler said he did the fire hydrant flushing earlier this month and the hydrant did not open on Minor Street. Met with Wagontown Construction and the fire hydrant is not repairable. The cost to replace the fire hydrant is \$3,990.00. Councilman Snyder made a motion to approve Wagontown Construction to replace the fire hydrant at a cost of \$3,990.00, 2nd by Councilman Cummings, motion carried. After some discussion, EEMA will provide a report on the water main valves that do and do not operate properly and implement a program to exercise the valves.

TREES AT TREATMENT PLANT

Councilman Cummings said he received an estimate from Sbandi's Landscaping for 30-6' Leyland trees installed for \$3,345.00. Councilman Duffy made a motion to approve \$3,345.00 for the trees and installation at the treatment plant, 2nd by Councilman Shore, motion carried. Councilman Davis made a motion to approve up to \$1,000.00 to clean the vines off the fence, 2nd by Councilman Duffy, motion carried.

BOROUGH SOLICITOR'S REPORT

Glenn Diehl gave the following report:

PROPOSED AIRPORT HAZARD ZONING ORDINANCE

Councilman Shore made a motion to approve sending a letter to New Garden Airport to partner with them to develop and implement an Airport District Overlay Ordinance and apply for grant money to help with the cost of the ordinance, 2nd by Councilman Cummings, motion carried.

STATE STREET BRIDGE

The County Commissioner's have decided to rebuild the bridge but they do not want to accept ownership. Mr. Diehl said his opinion is that we do not take ownership because the Borough can't take a future 2 million dollar obligation. Councilman Duffy made a motion to pursue the ownership of the bridge, 2nd by Councilman Cummings, motion carried.

INDIAN RUN ROAD TREE ISSUE

The Borough Code allows the Borough to take the dead tree down on Indian Run Road but the issue is who is paying. Councilman Cummings will talk to Mr. Webb regarding the tree. Mr. Diehl will draft an ordinance regarding tree issues that will resolve future tree matters.

VICE PRESIDENT SHORE TURNED THE MEETING OVER TO PRESIDENT BRYAN

PROPOSED SOLICITATION ORDINANCE

Councilman Shore made a motion to approve advertising the proposed solicitation ordinance, 2nd by Councilman Snyder, motion carried.

BOROUGH ENGINEER'S REPORT

Jamie MacCombie gave the following report:

WILKINSON PROJECT

Met with Dave Clark representing Wilkinson Builders and they are planning to submit within the next month Phase II A for final plan approval from Borough Council.

STATE STREET PHASE II - CONSTRUCTION FUND RELEASE #3

Councilman Snyder made a motion to authorize the release of \$51,149.70 to pay JFC Contractors subject to the County's approval, 2nd by Councilman Cummings, motion carried. Paving will start tomorrow weather permitting.

I & I PROJECT

Going back to the flows in 2006 and 2007 and after the I & I work, it is estimated that we have 40-45,000 gallons a day less flow after completed project. With this information and the new water and sewer ordinances, we are getting real close to meeting with DEP and hopefully requesting some additional flow for the Borough.

WELLHEAD PROTECTION

The documents have been put out to bid and the bids are to be received on December 1, 2010.

AVONDALE CENTER

Three bids were received for patching and repairs of sub-base in driveway and parking area.

Wagontown Construction \$5,925.00

Gaige Dirtworks \$4,805.00 no definitive scope of work was included

Shade Valley Excavation \$6,302.00

Councilman Snyder made a motion to approve Wagontown Construction to do the repairs for a cost of \$5,925.00, 2nd by Councilman Cummings, motion carried.

TURN AROUND AT WWTP

Councilman Shore made a motion to approve Dominick DiFilippo to put in the turn around at the WWTP at a cost of up to \$5,000.00 for the stone and labor, 2nd by Councilman Snyder, motion carried.

FINANCE COMMITTEE

APPROVE THE BILLS TO BE PAID

Councilman Snyder made a motion to approve the bills to be paid up to November 16, 2010, 2nd by Councilman Shore, motion carried.

APPROVE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Councilman Shore made a motion to approve the financial statements, 2nd by Councilman Davis, motion carried.

BUDGET 2011 – ADVERTISE

Council discussed whether they want to be paid. Council can be paid up to \$1,800 per year and the Mayor up to \$2,500. Council agreed not to take payment. Councilman Davis made a motion to advertise the 2011 budget, 2nd by Councilman Cummings, motion carried.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Councilman Cummings made a motion to approve the minutes from October 19th and October 29th, 2nd by Councilman Shore, motion carried.

Mayor Howell gave the following report

TREE LIGHTING

The Christmas Tree Lighting will take place at Servpro on December 4th at 6:30 p.m.. Mayor Howell asked Council for \$300.00 to buy hot chocolate and cookies for this event. Councilman Shore made a motion to approve \$300.00 for supplies for the event, 2nd by Councilman Snyder, motion carried.

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT COORDINATOR

Councilman Shore said there is an AGREM meeting this Thursday at 6:30 p.m. at Lincoln University if anyone is interested in attending.

STREET AND STREET LIGHTS COMMITTEE

SIGNAL SERVICE - TRAFFIC LIGHTS CONTRACT

Councilman Shore made a motion to approve Signal Service to maintain the signal traffic lights at a cost of \$650.00 per year with a two year contract, 2nd by Councilman Snyder, motion carried.

CAMERAS FOR TRAFFIC LIGHT CONTROL

Two proposals were received for camera's to control the signals at First Street/State Street and Pennsylvania Avenue. Mr. MacCombie will get one more proposal.

<u>POMEROY AVENUE – DUST CONTROL</u>
Councilman Snyder made a motion to approve Martin Paving at a cost of \$1,610.00 to put down dust oil on Pomeroy Avenue from Third Street to the first bridge, 2nd by Councilman Cummings, motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS

DECEMBER MEETING

Councilman Shore made a motion to approve up to \$400.00 for food and supplies at the December meeting, 2nd by Councilman Snyder, motion carried.

Councilman Snyder made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 8:20 p.m., 2nd by Councilman Davis, motion carried.
