IMPORTANT TRASH NEWS

- 1) Mattresses must be wrapped in plastic to be picked up by AJ Blosenski. If mattresses are not wrapped, they will not be collected. Mattresses that are not picked up should be stored properly and not left on porches or propped against houses.
- 2) Bulk trash cannot be kept out for the entire month. The earliest it can be placed outside is the weekend prior to the scheduled bulk trash pickup.
- 3) Bulk trash pickup occurs on the last Monday of each month.
- 4) Failure to follow these rules may result in fines for residents.

MORE IMPORTANT TRASH AND RECYCLING NEWS

1. Residents can only dispose of trash that fits inside their AJ Blosenski trash container. Extra bags cannot be piled around or into the container. The container must not be overloaded and must be able to close.
2. The same rule applies to recycling containers.
3. Residents may face fines for not adhering to this rule.

It's important for residents to be aware of these regulations to ensure proper trash disposal and avoid potential penalties.

2022 ANNUAL DRINKING WATER QUALITY REPORT

The 2022 Safe Drinking Water Report (aka the Consumer Confidence Report) is available online at www.avondaleboro.net. This report provides important information regarding the safety and quality of the drinking water provided to every customer in the Borough. You can pick up a hard copy in the Borough office. This report is a compilation of all PADEP required testing results from quality control tests conducted on your drinking water as it is treated and delivered to your household throughout the calendar year. Examples of tests that are regularly taken are: chlorine residual, lead, copper and nitrates, among others. These water quality tests ensure that your drinking water has been treated and is potable (safe to consume).
